Legislation provides rules for the safe inspection, maintenance and operation of lifting equipment all over North America. Articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity can only be operated by operators who are accredited. Operators have to be knowledgeable about the operational characteristics and features of the equipment. Prior to use, a pre-operational equipment check needs to be performed. There is a legal prerequisite to do a pre-operational check and an inspection of the work-site ground and overhead conditions.

The manufacturer's guidelines provide information regarding inspection and maintenance, loading and unloading of the crane. The law requires daily and annual inspections. Drivers should maintain an up-to-date logbook within nearly all places. They might be needed to confirm equipment warranties.

It is recommended that companies include remote control devices to their cranes. Remote control improves safety by enabling the driver an easier alternative for handling the crane.

Improving crane safety will normally help a company's bottom line. Those companies that follow safe machine practices would typically see greater cost savings compared to companies which don't. The risk of machine damage and personal injury is greatly lessened when a driver who is well-trained is handling the crane. Safety conscious operators are more productive resulting in reduced times required for unloading and loading.
