The business incorporates many of the simple design elements of that original lift into existing versions.

JLG forklifts have come a ways from the time when Mr. John L. Grove returned to town from his cross-country road trip and since the initial aerial work platform debuted on the market. These days, the business proudly continues to expand itself into a range of markets worldwide and develops new products to make certain consumers are capable of being more effective and perform in the workplace within a safer environment.
